She's the goddess of the chastity and of the Moon

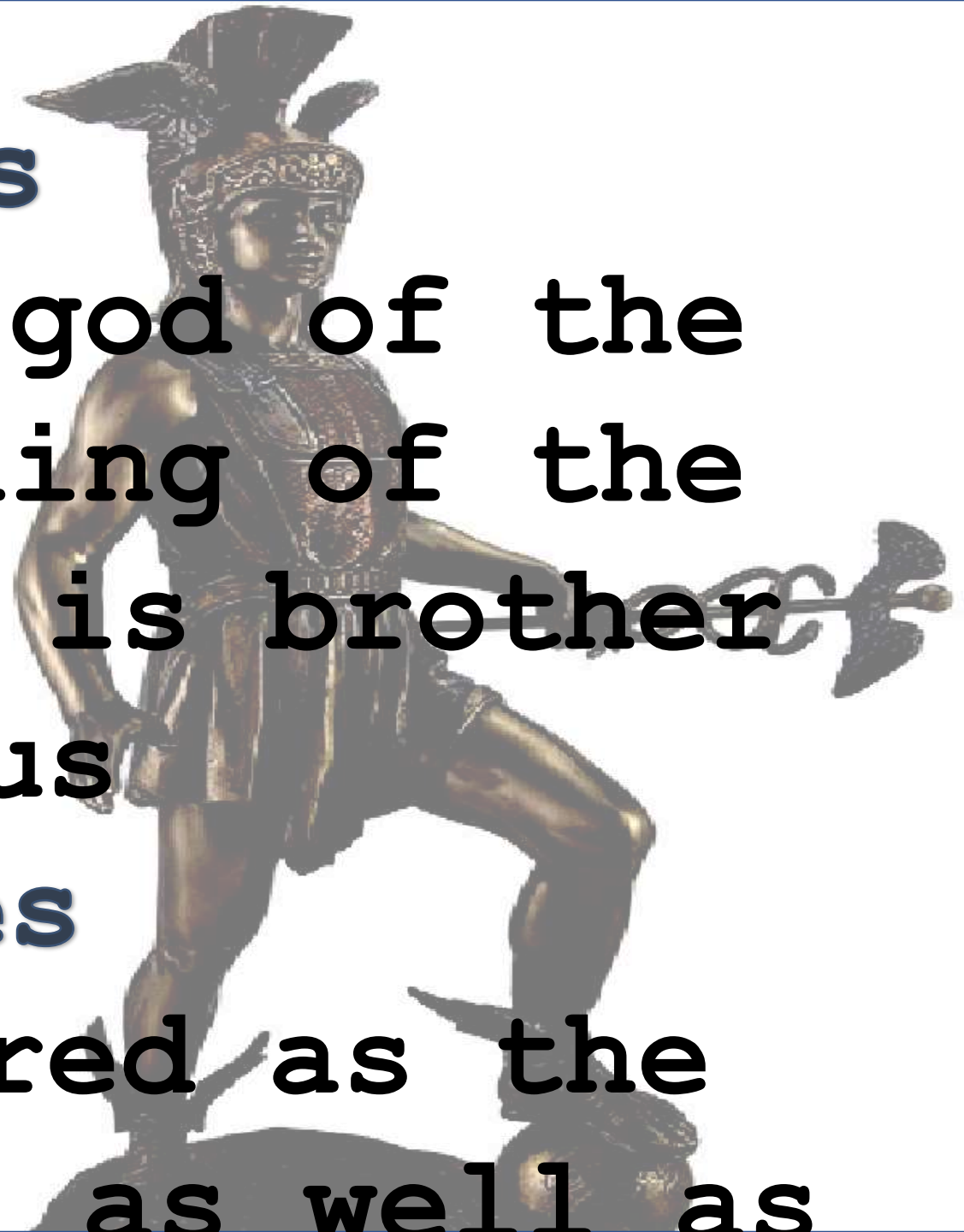
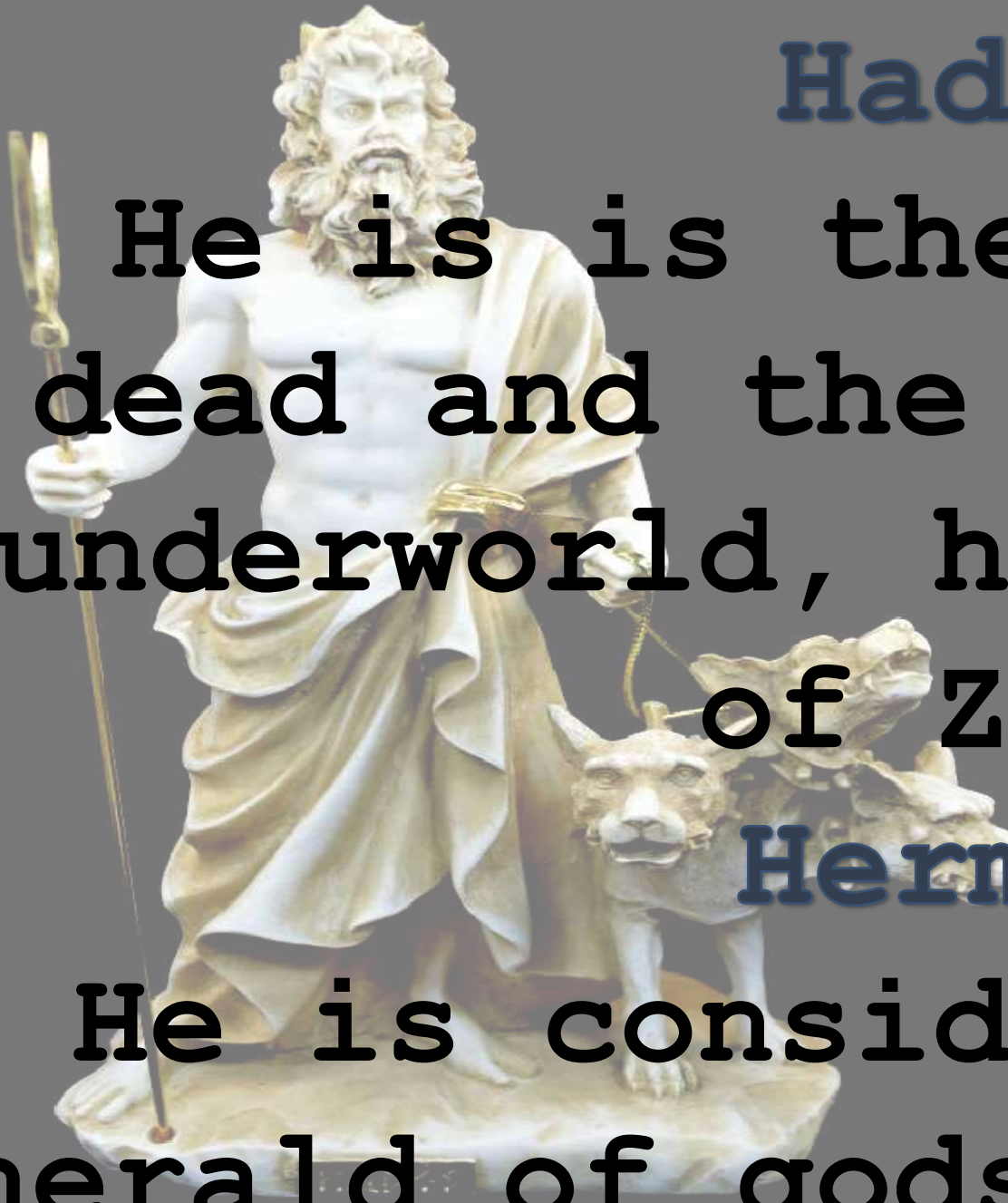


Hades

This divinity was very powerful because it dominated the clouds, the rain, the skies, so it was responsible for the lightning.



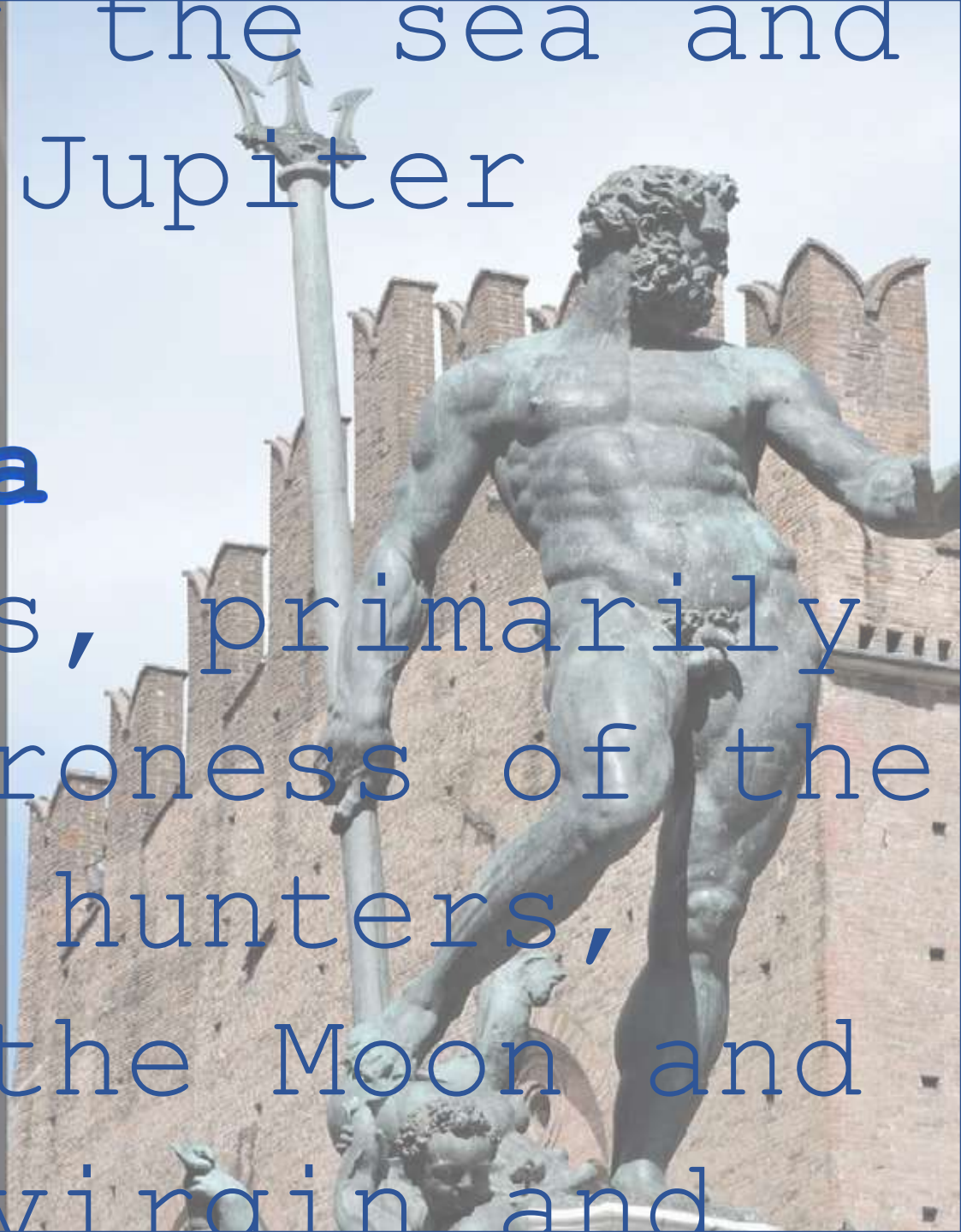
Mercury

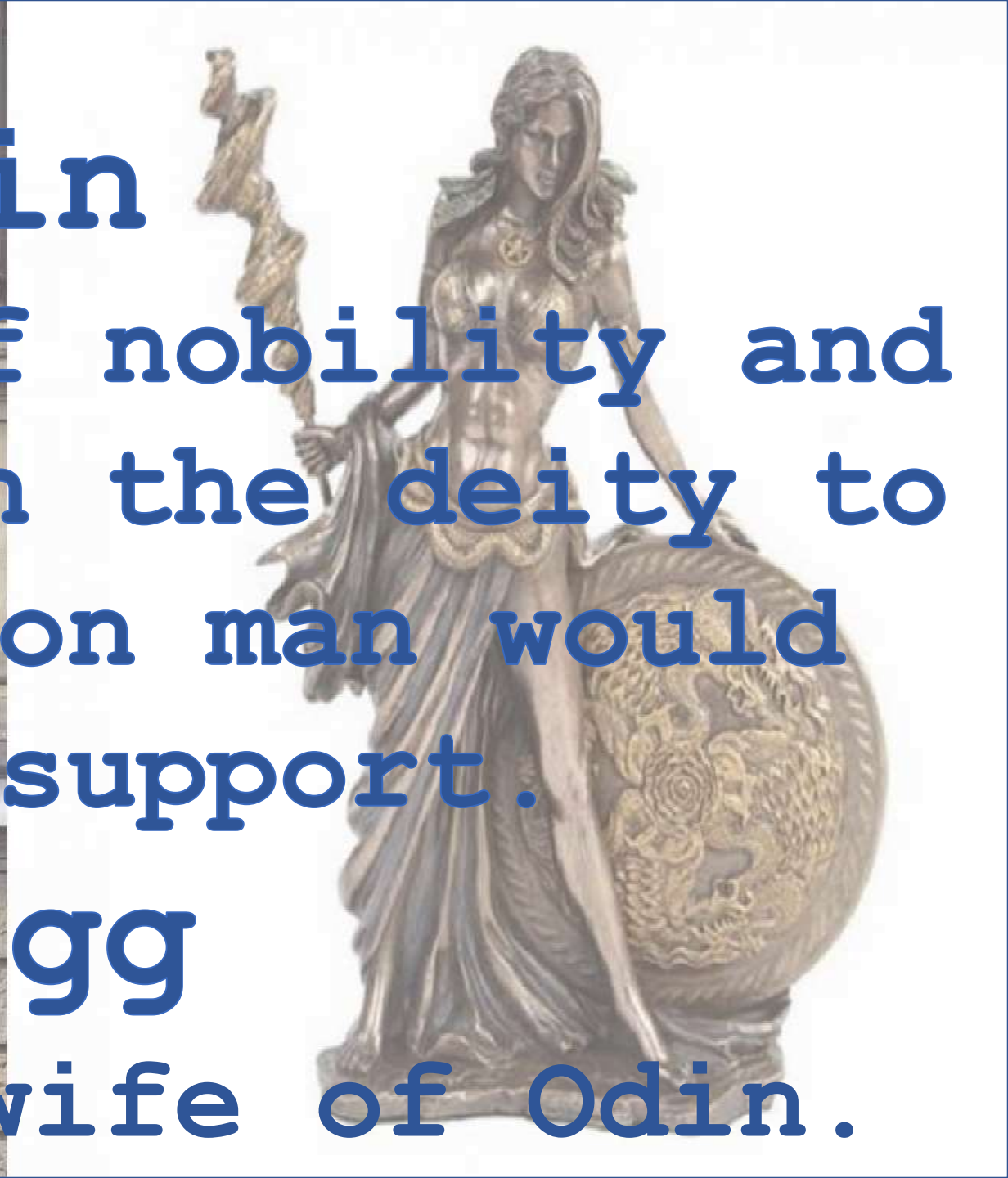
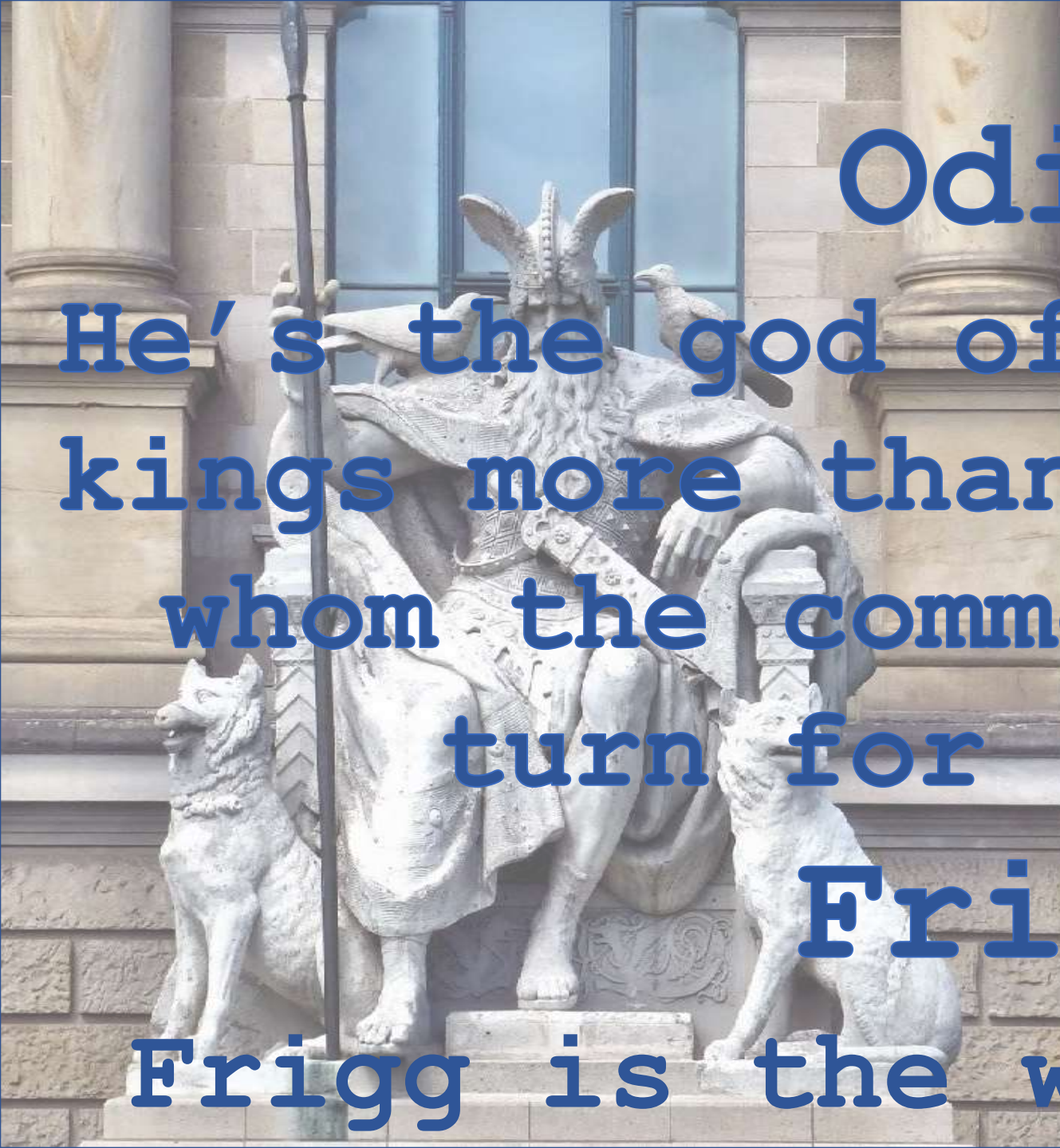
Old Norse sources

THE MYTH TALOS

The story of Talos offers one of the earliest conceptions of a robot:

Talos was a giant automaton made of bronze to protect Europa, mother of King Minos of Crete, in Crete from pirates and invaders. He circled the island's shores

THE HISTORY OF BLUETOOTH SYSTEM
